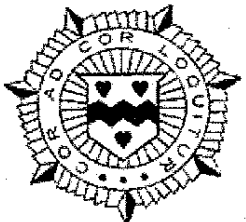

FROM THE DESK OF Fr. Dave

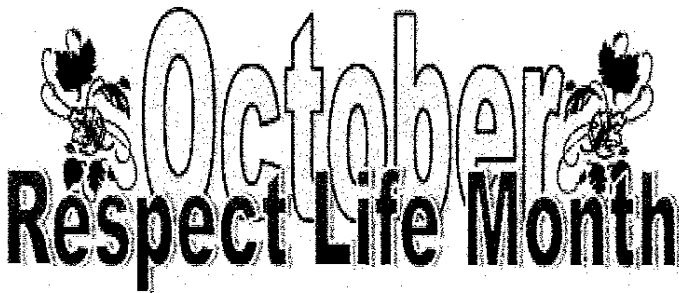

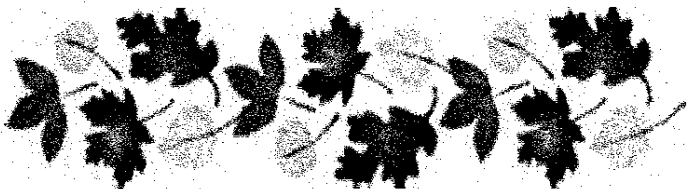

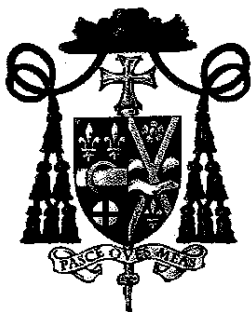
SOCIAL CONCERNS & OUTREACH

In 2013 we established the Incarnation of Our Lord St. Vincent DePaul Society. Our goal was twofold – to identify ways to emulate our patron saint by serving those in need, and to grow deeper in our own faith.

Our mission is to provide support in an understanding, gentle, and nonjudgmental manner to our parishioners and those within our parish territory. Our clients are important to us as people; we empathize with them and their challenges. They are members of our community and we “know” them.

Through the Society, we established two key programs: the food pantry and our parishioner program. The food pantry is held on the fourth Saturday of every month. Our parishioner program is utilized for an “as needed” basis. In addition to this, we have been blessed to help other organizations and people. We have made donations to and supported The Monocacy Farm Project, and they have reciprocated by providing us with freshly picked vegetables for our food pantry. We have supported Victory House, an organization here on the South Side of Bethlehem, which provides shelter for the homeless and in particular, homeless veterans. We have been blessed to be able to help people outside our parish and territory when they have found themselves in difficult situations such as escaping an abusive relationship or an unfortunate disability resulting in the loss of work and income.

What we need from our parish family is your continued support—both financial and through your volunteerism. We have an amazing parish family and you are the reason we are able to do what we do.

World Mission Sunday

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Annually, the next-to-last Sunday of October marks the Church's Eucharistic celebration for the Missions, **World Mission Sunday**.

In his message for this year's celebration on October 21st, Pope Francis explains that "life is a mission." "Each one of us is called to reflect on this fact: 'I *am* a mission on this Earth; that is the reason why I am here in this world' (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 273)," he writes. Focusing on young people, he notes: "In speaking to you, I also address all Christians who live out in the Church the adventure of their life as children of God."

I invite all of us in the Diocese of Allentown to see World Mission Sunday as a special moment to live out the mission we share as God's children, the mission to bring the Gospel to the whole world. I encourage you to be a "voice for mission" through your prayers and through the help that you are able to give in support of the priests, religious, and lay pastoral leaders who work tirelessly day in and day out, proclaiming the Gospel, building the Church, and serving the poor in more than 1,100 mission dioceses in Asia and Africa, the Pacific Islands, and parts of Latin America and Europe.

The prayers and material aid generously given to the collection for the Society for the Propagation of the Faith on World Mission Sunday, the Pope explains, continue to generously support the "fervent preaching of the Gospel to every nation," thus contributing to the human and cultural growth of all those who thirst for knowledge of the truth."

"Mission revitalizes faith," Pope Francis reminds us, quoting Pope Saint John Paul II in *Redemptoris Missio* (#2). May your commitment to the Lord's continuing mission renew your faith and be a blessing in your life. And may you know of my personal gratitude for your generous response on this unique day for the entire Church, and throughout the year as you are able.
